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Alireza Foroumadi, born on November 3, 1964, in Iran, is a professor at department of medicinal chemistry, faculty of pharmacy and the institute of pharmaceutical sciences (TIPS), Tehran University of Medical Sciences. He earned his Ph.D. in Medicinal Chemistry in 1996 and his Pharm.D. in 1990 from the same institution. He completed postdoctoral research fellowships at Teikyo University under the supervision of Prof. S. Ikegami (Aug 1996–Feb 1997) and at University College London (UCL) under the supervision of Prof. C. R. Ganellin (Sep 2002–Feb 2003). His research focuses on designing and synthesizing heterocyclic compounds, as potential antibacterial, antifungal, anti-diabetic, anticancer and anti-Alzheimer's agents. Ranked among the top 1% of the world's most cited researchers, he has an impressive research background, with numerous publications in medicinal chemistry. His dedication to medicinal chemistry along with impactful research, has significantly improved this field. Recently, his work has focused on the innovative design and synthesis of novel kinase inhibitors as anticancer agents.

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
